

## Dane County Clean Sweep and Product Exchange

### Household Clean Sweep

The Dane County Clean Sweep Program provides an opportunity for residents of Dane County to safely dispose of household hazardous materials free of charge. The site is located at 2302 Fish Hatchery Road in Madison, on the corner of Fish Hatchery and Badger Roads. It is open on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Clean Sweep site is open from May through October.

Examples of items that can be brought to Clean Sweep are: partially full or full aerosol cans, antifreeze, cleaners or products that contain acids such as drain cleaners, pool chemicals and muriatic acid, pesticides or herbicides, oil based paints and thinners, gasoline and kerosene.



Clean Sweep does not accept tires, yard waste, construction debris, asbestos or appliances.

### Product Exchange

The Product Exchange offers high quality and usable products brought into Clean Sweep to residents free of charge. When you bring in products that are in good and usable condition, it is stocked at the Clean Sweep Product Exchange as a kind of “free store” open to the public. Clean Sweep attempts to reuse or recycle as much of the material as possible that is brought into the facility.



## Agricultural Clean Sweep

Agricultural Clean Sweep allows farmers and rural landowners the opportunity to dispose of unwanted pesticides and other chemicals. It has been expanded to include individuals who have purchased or inherited rural property and found chemicals in their outbuildings. The first 200 pounds of chemicals are taken free for farmers. Waste amounts over 200 pounds may require a per pound charge although in some circumstances the fee can be waived.



Agricultural Clean Sweep is a “**preregistration only**” program. Brochures and registration forms are available at the Bristol Town Hall.

## Small Business Hazardous Waste Collection

Businesses can dispose of hazardous materials and wastes conveniently and cost effectively through the Dane County Clean Sweep Small Business Hazardous Waste Disposal Program. Businesses classified as Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQGs) can dispose of their hazardous wastes by supplying an inventory of materials for disposal. Clean Sweep will then schedule an appointment to drop the materials off on a Thursday between May and October.

Common hazardous wastes that are accepted include: automotive products, ballasts, corrosives, insecticides and pesticides, mercury, paints, solvents and solvent based products, degreasers and strippers, adhesives, glues and caulks.

## BRISTOL RECYCLE CENTER

The Bristol Recycle Center is located on County Road N, adjacent to the north side of the Town Hall.

### HOURS:

April 1 - October 31: Saturdays 7:30am to noon and Monday evenings 4 to 7pm. (Note: In the event that Monday is a holiday, the recycle center will be open on Tuesday evening from 4 to 7pm)

November 1—March 31: Saturdays only from 7:30am to 1pm

### PERMITS REQUIRED:

A permit is required for use of the Town Recycle Center. A yearly sticker may be purchased at the Town Hall or from the Recycle Center. A yearly sticker allows unlimited use during any open hours. The yearly cost is set by the Town Board during the budget process (usually October) and is subject to change. The cost for 2020 is \$200. For those wishing to use the center only occasionally, a single trip permit may be purchased from the attendants upon entering the recycle center. The 2020 single trip permit is \$20. Please be sure to stop at the attendant building to pay for your permit before unloading your items.

### PERMITTED USE:

The Bristol Recycle Center is for the disposal of recycling and household waste for Town residents ONLY. **No commercial dumping is permitted.**



## WHAT DOES THE TOWN RECYCLE CENTER TAKE?



- Non-recyclable trash should be bagged and placed in the compactor.
- Recyclables can be co-mingled and put in one of the large brown recycle dumpsters. **Recyclable materials include:** aluminum cans, newspapers, magazines and other papers that are not wax-coated, cardboard (PLEASE flatten before placing boxes in dumpsters!), glass jars/bottles, and plastic containers marked numbers 1 - 7.
- Appliances: refrigerators/freezers/air conditioners/humidifiers/dehumidifiers/microwaves and electronics (TV's/computers, etc.) are **NOT** accepted at the recycle center.
- Clean wood (unpainted, untreated) and branches should be placed on the burn pile.
- Furniture, mattresses and carpet can be placed in the furniture dumpster. Please cut carpeting into manageable size pieces to avoid clogging the dumpster. **These items may require a separate fee.**
- Yard Waste is collected in a separate yard waste dumpster on a seasonal basis only from April 1 through October 31. Only grass, leaves and plant material are considered yard waste. Since the yard waste is sent to the Dane County compost site, it is important that no trash, plastic bags, etc. are put in the yard waste dumpster.
- Scrap metal - there is a separate dumpster for scrap metal.
- Automotive batteries should be given to the attendant. Do not throw in with garbage or recyclables.
- Fluorescent light bulbs contain toxic heavy metals that are hazardous to the environment. **The recycle center does accept these items for a separate fee.**
- Other items NOT accepted include: medical waste, hazardous materials, electronics, pesticides, explosives, paint, tires, and items containing asbestos.

## SO HOW CAN I RECYCLE OR DISPOSE OF....

### Appliances containing refrigerant

Check the Dane County website at <https://pwht.countyofdane.com/recycle/landfill.aspx> for a list of businesses that recycle these appliances, or check with local appliance stores such as Handy Appliance in Sun Prairie for assistance. Please note that there will usually be a charge for this service.

### Motor Oil & Oil Filters

Effective January 1, 2011, Wisconsin has banned all engine oil filters from landfills. They must now be recycled. Some auto parts stores are now accepting the used filters for recycling. Call ahead as charges may apply. Used motor oil is accepted at JRC Auto Repair, at the intersection of Highway 151 and County Road V.

### Electronics

Electronics contain a number of toxic materials including lead and mercury which are hazardous and cannot be introduced into a landfill.
